	<p>screening</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To provide key messages on cancer prevention and early diagnosis</li><li>• To support the role of staff in services to meet the needs of women with intellectual disabilities and the people who support them</li><li>• Develop an understanding on the key issues to be explored and how to answer and advise on any questions or queries</li><li>• Develop awareness of resources and systems available, so they can then advise and direct people appropriately</li><li>• Have a clear understanding of our key messages for women to enable them to make an informed choice about screening</li></ul>
